Importantly, we need to have a discussion about whether to endorse the most recent <u>CPS levy</u>. Here are the facts:

- \$51.5 million dollars or 6.8 Mils
- Renewal due in 2023
- 10 year levy (replaces a 5 year levy)
- No increase in taxes
- Funds go into general operating funds (makes up 9.1% of operating funds)
- Increased CPS enrollment

We usually support these levies, especially if just a renewal, but we need to be open to objections.

Through email, please make your arguments for or against this levy. I will call for a vote on August 31.
